The second is the WORLD EVANGELISM FUND, which fuels the Church of the Nazarene's mission by combining gifts from each person and church to fund ministries everywhere.

Through the ALABASTER OFFERING, the third emphasis, ministries around the world receive funds to purchase property and buildings.

The fourth is to **ENGAGE CHILDREN AND YOUTH** through education and fostering calls to missions.

<u>CARE & CONNECTION</u> (LINKS) is the last area of emphasis, strategically connects Nazarene missionaries and Nazarene churches through prayer, personal contact, and generous giving.

Prayer Alabaster World Evangelism Fund Engaging Children and Youth Care & Connection

We aim for each church to participate in these five areas, and then adding additional areas of connection, to match the interests and needs of each local congregation or district.

<u>Awards</u> given at the NC Mission District Advance Conference. We encourage every local church to become a World Evangelism Church and a Missions Priority One Church.

World Evangelism Church

Churches that give at least 5.5% of their income to the World Evangelism Fund have met the minimum goal in their support of the global mission. These churches are the lifeblood of the Church of the Nazarene's mission to the nations.

Missions Priority One Church

Missions Priority One is a way to recognize if a church has embraced the Five Areas of Impact of Nazarene Missions International: Prayer, World Evangelism Fund, Alabaster, Engaging Children and Youth, and Care & Connection. To be a MPO Church you must have participated in each of these five areas and check yes on your annual report.

World Evangelism Church of Excellence

Churches that give at least 5.7%, or \$1,500 or more beyond 5.5%, whichever is less, to the World Evangelism Fund.

HONORS

Distinguished Service Award-The Distinguished Service Award (DSA) is a tribute to church people who are living and for their service to the church. Although the DSA is given through NMI, it need not be given in the area of missions. A church may wish to honor anyone in the church for their efforts. The DSA may only be given by a church or a group within the church. Individuals may not give this award. A DSA may be awarded to a couple as long as only one tribute message is submitted.

The cost of the DSA is USD\$125. Duplicates of the award are \$25 each. Churches are encouraged to frame the DSA. The certificate fits into a standard 8"x10" frame.

Please read the <u>DSA Guidelines</u> for further details. To order a DSA:

- Due to the time constraints of printing and shipping orders we no longer can accommodate rushed orders. Please allow 5-10 business days for delivery.

- Print the DSA order form
- Fill out the order form.

Note: When designating the "tribute," please stay within the space allotted--4 lines, 60 characters per line (including punctuation and spaces).

- Fill out a church remittance form
- Send the order form, remittance form, and a check for \$125 to your regional office.
- Please allow 3-5 weeks for delivery.

Memorial Roll- The Memorial Roll, established in 1919, is a way to honor deceased friends and loved ones. A certificate is issued in the name of the person memorialized and is often presented to a family member or displayed in the church. Churches or individuals may place as many names on the Memorial Roll as they desire, and those memorialized need not be members of the church.

The cost of placing someone on the Memorial Roll is USD\$75. You will receive a certificate that fits into a standard 8"x10" frame. Duplicates of the certificate are \$25 each.

A Children's version is available, too.

To order a Memorial Roll:

1. Order Online

- Use Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express.
- Due to the time constraints of printing and shipping orders we no longer can accommodate rushed orders. Please allow 5-10 business days for delivery.

2. Order by Mail

- Print the Memorial Roll order form
- Fill out the order form.
- Fill out a church remittance form
- Send the order form, remittance form, and a check for \$75 to your regional office.
- Please allow 3-5 weeks for delivery.

Children's Memorial Roll- The Children's Memorial Roll is a great way to honor deceased children and contribute to the NMI Missionary Health Care, which provides health insurance for Nazarene missionaries and their families.

The cost of placing someone on the Memorial Roll is USD\$75. You will receive a certificate that fits into a standard 8"x10" frame. Duplicates of the certificate are \$25 each."

To order a Children's Memorial Roll:

What is Alabaster?

The Alabaster Offering provides funds for property and buildings around the world. While we understand the church consists of the people of God and not a building, buildings erected for the purpose of ministry help provide a sense of permanence, functionally enhance ministry efforts, and convey an attitude that the Church of the Nazarene intends to "put down roots."

Use of Alabaster funds

Alabaster funds are to be used for new churches to:

- · Purchase a property or church building
- Purchase or build a church parsonage
- Build a church building
- Conversion of a property into a church gathering space
- Meet initial costs for renting a church meeting space for a limited period

Alabaster funds may also be used to:

- Purchase or build missionary homes
- Purchase or build regional or field missions facilities
- Build or repurpose buildings on Bible college campuses

We receive Alabaster offerings in February and September.

These gifts are sent through the Global Treasury Services to the World Evangelism Fund. Church gifts are automatically recorded on FundingtheMission.org that helps churches track their giving goals. Individuals can choose to give Mission Special recognition to their church during the giving process. Legacy and estate gifts may also be given through the Nazarene Foundation. Some congregations choose to raise funds through the <u>Easter Offering and Offering of Thanks</u>. These two offerings have been received each year for more than 100 years. The <u>Stewardship</u> <u>Development</u> team provides promotional and informational resources to help churches communicate the offerings to their congregations. Churches also use <u>Faith Promise pledges</u> to raise funds throughout the year. We encourage pastors and NMI presidents to actively engage their people in understanding and giving toward mission work through the World Evangelism Fund. Many churches choose to invest more than the 5.5% goal toward ministry, and those gifts make a huge difference.

Nazarene Missions International Fast Facts

- The Church of the Nazarene ministers in **164 world areas**. During the 2021 General Board, **Luxembourg**, on the Eurasia Region, became the latest world area to receive approval for official entry.
- In 2020, there were **531 missionaries** originating from **64 world areas**, serving in **96 countries**. Of these missionaries, **361 served as global deployed** and **170 were sponsored deployed**. Last year,

there were **66 new missionary deployments** (some of whom are awaiting their departure for the field, due to COVID-19 travel restrictions). Within these missionary families, there are **302 missionary kids**.

- The number of Nazarene churches grew to **31,049 churches**, an increase of 0.56 percent, with **2.64 million members**, an increase of 0.90 percent increase from last year.
- In 2020, there were 489 districts around the world, with 30,184 credentialed clergy.
- 51 educational institutions, including graduate seminaries/theological colleges, 13 liberal arts colleges/universities, 30 undergraduate seminaries/theological/Bible colleges, 2 nurses training colleges, 1 teacher training college, and 1,411 education centers (extension) had a 2020 combined enrollment of 49,244 students globally.
- Persons in need were treated at **community-based clinics and health care centers** all over the world with concentrated efforts in India, Papua New Guinea, and Eswatini (formerly known as Swaziland).
- **406 retired missionaries** received benefits through the Global Missions Pension Plan for the 2019-2020 fiscal year.
- NMI membership was 1,058,137, with the number of organized local NMIs rising to 19,143
- JESUS Film Harvest Partners (JFHP), raising \$3.67 million, reports that World Evangelism Fund(WEF) helped provide infrastructure for 847 JFHP teams to share God's love. In 2019–2020, the teams reported 1.9 million evangelistic contacts. Of these contacts, 511,097 indicated decisions for Christ with 314,924 initial discipleship follow-ups. The teams started 8,632 preaching points in 2020.
- NMI and others partnered with local churches to help raise **US \$37.09 million through the World Evangelism Fund** during the 2019-2020 fiscal year.
- Churches globally gave US \$25.88 million for Approved Mission Specials.\
- In 2020, 77 districts gave 5.5 percent of their income and beyond to the World Evangelism Fund (52 of which were from regions other than the US/Canada region). WEF giving beyond 5.5 percent helps open new work, sustains works opened in recent years, and helps send new missionaries that God calls.1
- ¹ "New work" refers to new world areas, a geographical area, or new entities such as institutions. Pioneer areas or Phase 1 districts are considered new work. When a district reaches Phase 2, it is no longer a "new work."

- Missionary Health Care provided US \$304,671 in medical assistance for Nazarene missionaries,through offerings, Memorial Roll gifts, and Distinguished Service Award gifts.
- Nazarenes gave **US \$233,667 to World Mission Broadcast (WMB)**, providing radio, television, and Internet programs to share the gospel globally.
- Nazarenes gave **US \$3.07 million in deputation** offerings for missionaries.
- NMI has more than **269 districts worldwide participating in Links**, contributing **\$186,051**, and creating personalized connections between local churches, districts, and missionaries around the world. Each connection is vital in continuing to share about the impact of missions.
- Nazarenes gave **US \$2.4 million for Alabaster**, to fund construction projects in 2020. The Alabaster Offering is used in all six global regions.** No Alabaster funds are used for administrative costs.
- International Student Scholarship Fund (NMI 80th Anniversary project) provided 86 scholarships for students outside the USA/Canada to attend Nazarene theological institutions.
- NMI partnered with **Nazarene Compassionate Ministries** to give **more than US \$4.3 million**, for disaster response and compassion projects around the world and to support **11,951 children** through Child Development Centers and Pastor's Kid programs.
- NMI assisted **Work & Witness** in raising approximately **US \$1.01 million**, to deploy **270 teams**, an **average of 4.82 teams per week. 2,659 volunteers** participated in Work & Witness in 2020, donating **173,023 hours of labor (or 86.5 years of labor)**.
- Nazarene churches around the world operated 1,353 pre-school, primary, and secondary schools with a total enrollment of 162,797 students.

God has blessed the efforts of the Church of the Nazarene during the COVID-19 pandemic, extending grace, bringing hope, and ministering peace to those in need of Him around the world. Thank you for your faithfulness in these uncertain times.

Care & Connection (LINKS)

Links is a network of personal connections between missionaries and Nazarene districts around the world.

Participating missionaries are assigned to districts to help foster a personal connection between missionaries and the local church. A Links relationship fosters a sense of involvement with Nazarene Missions through regular correspondence from missionaries, updates from their field of service, and presentations by their Links missionary when they are on home assignment.

How does our church make a Links connection?

Each district is assigned Links missionaries. Reach out to your District NMI President for details regarding the missionary family. Then...

Make personal contact with the missionary at the email address provided.

Learn as much as possible about the missionary and the field they serve on.

Introduce the missionary to your church.

Share about your church with the missionary.

Pray for each other regularly.

Work with your District NMI President to schedule a time when they can speak at your church when on home assignment.

How can we best encourage Links missionaries?

By getting to learn and know more about each other, your local church and Links family will feel more connected. Share life together, pray for each other, communicate as often as possible, give as you feel moved by the Holy Spirit, and schedule a time to connect over video on when they are on home assignment.

How do I give a gift to Links missionaries?

Generosity is one of the greatest expressions of love. If an individual, church, or district would like to show love to a Links-assigned missionary through giving, please follow these guidelines.

- Sending physical letters or packages are discouraged unless the missionary has a specific need and requests the items be shipped. Districts and churches are encouraged to coordinate with missionaries when they are on home assignment rather than shipping items to their country of service. Physical package can have very expensive duties that the missionary has to pay when receiving your package. Please always ask the missionary before you mail anything.
- When giving a financial gift, there are multiple ways to send it in.

Write a check – When sending a Links gift as a local church, for faster processing we are recommending to first send it to the District office. They are then able to send one check of all your Districts donations rather than spending money on multiple processing fees for smaller checks.

If you choose to send in the check from your local church do not make checks payable to your missionary. Such gifts run contrary to IRS guidelines. Instead, make it payable to Global Treasury

Services with "[Missionary Name(s)] Links" in the memo line. Mail it to P.O. Box 843116 Kansas City, MO 64184-3116.

Give online using Funding the Mission – Use the Funding the Mission page at https://fundingthemission.org/. Note "[Missionary Name]'s Links" in the memo for the gift.

Give through the online missionary profile – Give your deputation offering by visiting the missionary's profile. There is a place to note "[Missionary name]'s Links." You can find your missionary's profile at nazarene.org/missionary-profiles

Please do not give a missionary a cash or personal check offering. That is still taxable income for a missionary, and you would need to provide a 1099 tax form to assist the missionary in their end-of-year taxes.

Why can't I find our missionaries' addresses on the web?

To ensure the safety and privacy of missionaries, missionary address and phone information will not be shared by NMI or Global Missions. If you need this information for a missionary, please contact either your district NMI president or your district Links coordinator who will work directly with each Links missionary.

What is Missionary Care?

Missionary care is an important strategy of Nazarene Missions International (NMI) to help provide for personal needs of missionaries. These expressions of care include:

Links: a strategy for "linking" churches with missionaries through prayer and personal contact. Missionary Christmas Fund: provides a monetary Christmas gift for missionaries.

Missionary Health Care: monies collected through the Memorial Roll and Distinguished Service Award used to subsidize missionary health care costs.

Distinguished Service Award: a certificate presented to an individual to recognize outstanding service to God and the church. The presenter (usually a church or district) contributes \$125 to Missionary Health Care.



DEPUTATION

The Church of the Nazarene funds its mission's enterprise, and supports missionary families, through the World Evangelism Fund (WEF), which is given by local churches around the world throughout the year.

Missionaries supplement this fund by traveling to their home country every few years to raise money for specific ministry needs and projects, as well as to share with churches what God is doing around the world and inspire greater involvement with God through missions.

What is home assignment?

Most Nazarene missionaries visit their home country periodically to raise funds. These trips are called deputation, or home assignment. The money they raise pays for a variety of personal needs including medical expenses, home furnishing, transportation and special mission projects.

If and when you have a missionary come to your church for a deputation or Faith Promise service, here are a few things to remember while hosting:

Imagine having a Thanksgiving dinner every day for three months. Furlough fat is the fate of missionaries. Taking care of special church guests requires healthy hospitality.

When family comes to our house on vacation, we spoil and indulge them. We stay up late chatting or playing games. We go to the mall to shop for the upcoming family event. It is a break from their routine, a pleasure trip.

For many missionaries, however, travel is their job. They need a different type of caring. This thoughtfulness manifests itself in three fundamental areas: food, sleep and free time.

Potlucks can be challenging places for anyone who has to be careful about his or her health. People are emotionally invested in the food they bring. They want to prepare food the missionary will be talking about years later. They also do not want anyone to go away hungry. There seems to be no graceful way for the guest speaker to say, "I need to lose weight. Support me.

"Food, rest and fun are essential elements for guests to leave ready to carry on with their Godgiven work. Stamina is needed to constantly travel. Healthy hospitality helps

FAITH PROMISE

Faith Promise is a plan based on missions giving at systematic intervals rather than just twice a year. Through Faith Promise, People pray about the amount they should give for missions (over and above their tithe). The amount is often given weekly, biweekly, or monthly.

How to prepare and plan Faith Promise with your pastor and council:

- a. Set the date and plan a Faith Promise emphasis.
- b. Discuss your specific responsibilities for the Faith Promise emphasis.
- c. Who will be the speaker? Who will book the speaker?
- d. Length of Faith Promise emphasis: Saturday? Sunday morning only? Sunday morning & evening? Saturday night & Sunday morning?
- e. Plan for special gatherings? Friday evening rally, Saturday men's breakfast, women's lunch, teen pizza party Saturday night?

Ask about a missions bulletin board, the church calendar, and how and when the deadlines are for submitting mission information for the Sunday morning church worship folder, church newsletter, or website.

Discuss the amount that needs to be raised for mission for the coming year, starting with the WEF (5.5%), special offerings, local NMI Council expenses, missionary speakers—both care and offerings.

Each person needs to hear of God's saving power and experience transformation in their hearts and lives. This compels teams to share the gospel with their neighbors through the *JESUS* film, EvangeCubes, Audio Bibles, and other powerful tools.

Discipleship

JESUS Film teams are committed to discipling new believers on the path to becoming mature Christians. 

Gifts-in-Kind (GIK) is a type of charitable giving in which, instead of giving money to buy needed goods and services, the goods and services are given. As Christians, we give because sharing with others is at the core of the Gospel.

A GIK shipment involves sending a 40-foot container, and in some instances, a 20-foot container, to Nazarene ministries overseas. The container, loaded with GIK items, is transported by truck to a nearby port, then loaded onto a sea vessel and shipped overseas. Containers can be purchased and will remain in the country of destination to be used by the recipient organization. The recipient organization is called the Consignee.

GIK SHIPPING STANDARDS

As a program, Gifts-in-Kind has earned an excellent reputation with several countries' governments that are skeptical of most donating programs. This program deals with an impressive amount of red tape in clearing shipments with different government's customs offices, but has been successful in building relationships and trust. Because of this reputation, we require high standards of quality of the donated goods. In this section you will find many guidelines we ask that you abide by. Please know this is not to be overly

picky, but to convey a message of love to the person who will eventually receive it as a gift from his brothers and sisters in Christ.

We follow the GIK Standards set by Accord (formerly known as AERDO). Accord serves Christian organizations and churches to achieve the highest standards, principles and effectiveness in their relief and development efforts. (Click here to review the Accord GIK Standards)

The Gifts-in-Kind program is one of the many ways we as a church body reach out in compassion to provide hope and help to the needy. It is a program made possible by your donations and willingness to volunteer. Thank you for helping us to be the hands and feet of Jesus around the world.

CRISIS CARE KIT PREPARATION

- 1. Gather **NEW** items in quantities listed below. Assemble Crisis Care Kits (CCKs) and seal the Ziploc bags. Include only those items listed below. **Deviating from this list can cause an entire shipment to be rejected in customs.** Set the CCKs in groups of six (6) to determine the number of banana boxes needed.
- 2. Pack contents below into a clear 2-gallon OR 2.5-gallon plastic Ziploc bag and seal:
 - -1 medium-size bottle of shampoo (12-18 oz.), please tape flip-tops closed
 - -2 bars of soap (bath-size or larger)
 - -1 medium toothpaste (4.0-6.4 oz.)
 - -3 toothbrushes (in original packaging)
 - -1 box of Band-Aids (30 or more)
 - -1 fingernail clipper
 - -1 sturdy hair comb
 - -2 hand towels
 - -4 pocket-size packages of facial tissue
 - -1 Beanie Baby-size stuffed toy
- Obtain the banana boxes from your local grocery store. Please ship CCKs solely in banana boxes, as they provide uniformity, eliminating wasted space in shipping.
- 4. Cut the heavy brown paper (usually found in the banana box) in half and place inside the bottom of the box. Tape the other half over the hole in the lid. (Plain cardboard may be used in the same way if your banana boxes are missing the paper.)
- 5. Fill each box with six (6) CCKs—no more, no less.
- 6. **Do not insert money or literature** (including anything with the church's name on it, notes, etc.) in the CCKs or banana boxes.
- 7. Using strong packing tape, cover all holes in the top and the bottom of the box. Then tape the box securely shut. Please leave box handles open; this makes it easier to load and unload.

- 8. When addressing the box, please put the name and address of the church (or individual donor) on the box in the "From" section and the address of the warehouse in the "To" section.
- 9. **Do not wrap banana boxes** in brown paper or contact paper or put filled banana boxes inside another box.
- 10. Bring the boxes to our MAC (District Convention) and the boxes and required check will be collected at the appointed collection point and time.
- 11. Bring a check from your church: Make your check payable to NC District NMI and "Earmark it CCKs/SPPs":

The check must be presented to those collecting the boxes to cover \$15.00 for each CCK box you bring to the district MAC (District Convention)

- The \$15.00 covers the following: The 12.00 storage fee required by the warehouse that helps ship these boxes anywhere in the world as needed and \$3.00 helps cover the district cost of delivering the boxes to the warehouse.
- Include the name and address of your church with the check.
 - Our treasurer will write one check for the storage fee and send a list of the churches that participated. <u>Ten Percent Credit will be allowed for the \$12.00 shipping donation only.</u> Do not put the money in the CCKs or banana boxes.

SCHOOL PAL-PAK PREPARATION

- 1. Gather **NEW** items in quantities listed below. Assemble School Pal-Paks (SPPs) and seal the Ziploc bags. Include only those items listed below. Deviating from this list can cause an entire shipment to be rejected in customs. Set the SPPs in groups of ten (10) to determine the number of boxes needed.
- 2. Pack contents below in a clear 1-gallon Ziploc bag and seal:
 - -2 composition notebooks (such as Mead brand), no larger than $9\frac{3}{4}$ "x - $7\frac{1}{2}$ ". (No spiral-bound notebooks will be accepted.)
 - -package of #2 pencils (quantity—10-12 pencils)
 - -package of black pens (quantity—10-12 pens)
 - -pink erasers, 2-3" long
 - -rulers (6" or 12", with metric measurements)
 - -package of colored pencils (quantity—12-15)
 - -pair of blunt-nosed scissors
 - -hand-held pencil sharpener

These contents will give each student a notebook, 5-6 pencils, 5-6 pens, an

- eraser, and a ruler. Two students will share the colored pencils, scissors, and sharpener.
- 3. Obtain 12"x12"x12" boxes from any office supply store such as Office Depot, Office Max, Staples, or a UPS store.
- 4. Fill each box with 10 Pal-Paks—no more, no less.
- 5. **Do not insert money or literature** (including anything with the church's name on it, notes, etc.) in the Pal-Paks or boxes.
- 6. Using strong packing tape, tape the box securely shut.
- 7. When addressing the box, please put the name and address of the church (or the individual donor) on the box in the "From" section and the address of the warehouse in the "To" section.
- 8. **Do not wrap boxes** in brown paper or contact paper or put filled boxes inside another box.
- 9. Bring a check from your church: Make your check payable to NC District NMI and "Earmark it CCKs/SPPs":

The check must be presented to those collecting the boxes to cover \$15.00 for each box you bring to the district MAC (District Convention)

- The \$15.00 covers the following: The 10.00 storage fee for SPP required by the warehouse that helps ship these boxes anywhere in the world as needed and \$5.00 helps cover the district cost of delivering the boxes to the warehouse.
- Include the name and address of your church with the check.
 - Our treasurer will write one check for the storage fee and send a list of the churches that participated. <u>Ten Percent Credit will be allowed for the \$12.00 shipping donation only.</u> Do not put the money in the CCKs or banana boxes.

HOW YOU CAN RAISE THE PER BOX SHIPPING COSTS

- Have a line item in your NMI budget.
- Take a special offering.
- Have fundraisers to cover cost. This would be a great project for teens.
- Encourage your church family to share the need with friends, neighbors, and relatives outside of the church.
- Check with business people.
- Pass out Quarter and Dime Coin Collectors (Quarters \$10.00 a roll and Dimes are \$5.00 per roll)

Standards and Goals 2022-2023

It is important that the Nazarene Missions International (NMI) work effectively in helping to carry out the Great Commission. Standards and Goals can help keep us moving in the right direction. Standards set up a rule for measuring. Goals encourage reaching ahead. May we strive to meet and exceed the goals established this year for God's eternal glory.

We, your committee on Standards and Goals, recommend the following:

- I. Each local church has an organized Nazarene Missions International
- A. Enroll all church members participating in the mission program of the local church as active members and enroll as associate members those people who are currently active in the mission program of the local church but are not members of the local congregation.
- II. B. Organize the following auxiliaries:
- 1. Children's chapter 2. Youth chapter
- C. Elect a local Work and Witness coordinator and participate in district Work and Witness projects and, if possible, plan a Work and Witness trip from your local church.
- D. Elect or appoint a Mission Call Director who actively seeks out, encourages and gives purposeful direction to children, youth who feel there is a possible call of God on their lives for missionary service. This Director will report the names and contact information for such individuals to the District Mission Call Director and the local pastor.

Each church pays its World Evangelism Fund (WEF) in full and strives to earn the Award of Excellence.

- A. This is achieved through accomplishing one or a combination of the following:
- 1. Thanksgiving Offering
- 2. Easter Offering
- 3. Prayer and Fasting Offering
- 4. Faith Promise Offering
- 5. Any offering designated as WEF Offering
- B. Award of Excellence: overpay the WEF by 3% or \$1,000.00 (whichever is less)

MISSION PRIORITY ONE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

1. Prayer-The church will pray for needs around the world as well as missions.

- 2. Alabaster- Churches participate in Alabaster offerings.
- 3. Children and Youth- the church will provide opportunity for its children and youth to experience missions and to respond to God's call.
- 4. Giving- The church will pay World Evangelism fund in full.
- 5. Care and Connection LINKS- Church prays for and connects with Nazarene Missionaries.
- III. Each local church fulfills the following financial responsibilities:
- A. Pay the North Carolina District budget in full
- B. Pay the LINKS apportionment by September 30 (we are the only District assigned to our LINKS missionaries)
- C. Participate in the Medical Plan through:
- 1. Memorial Roll
- 2. Distinguished Service Award
- 3. Special Medical Plan Offering in May
- 4. Gifts from the Heart
- D. Participate in World Evangelism Broadcast Offering (June emphasis)
- E. Participate in the Alabaster offering (September and February)
- F. Participate in the Compassionate Ministries Offering (December emphasis)
- G. Participate in the District Work and Witness Project Offering (October and March)
 - 1. Project Money goes entirely for materials/supplies to be used on the specific work assignment of the Work and Witness trip.
 - 2. Mail to District NMI Treasurer by October and March in order to help fund the Project Money for the District Work and Witness trips each year.
 - 3. That each church considers when providing its Work & Witness Project offerings the fact that the General church requires a minimum of \$10,000.00 per Work & Witness Project and that generally North Carolina attempts to have two District Work & Witness trips per year.
- H. If possible, each local church will host or co-host a missionary speaker each year and provide Deputation Offering in line with General NMI Handbook and Constitution recommendations.

The following minimum offering scale is recommended:

- 1. Sunday Morning Service...... \$400-500
- 2. Sunday Evening Service.....\$250-\$350
- 4. Faith Promise Convention.....\$700-No limit
- 5. District NMI Convention......\$1,000.00
- **IV.** Each local church finds a way to give 10% of the total church income to World Evangelism. Recognizing the impact that churches around the world have found by using Faith Promise giving as one of the most effective and powerful way to raise this WEF completely and even overpay it, every church is encouraged to at least try the method of Faith Promise to raise WEF and 10% giving.
- V. Each local church achieves Mission Priority One Award and North Carolina Honor Society status

PROCEDURES THAT WILL AID AND ASSIST THE LOCAL CHURCH IN REACHING ALL GOALS

- 1. Participation by each church in an organized PRAYER and fasting program a. Utilizing the Prayer Mobilization Line by Facebook: http://www.facebook.com/NMIPrayer b. Utilizing the Prayer Mobilization Line by Internet at http://www.nazarenemissions.org (then click on "Prayer Mobilization Line") c. Join our district Facebook page by logging on to your Facebook account and then typing NC District NMI
- 2. Promotion of mission education through mission reading books and other methods according to the guidelines/requirements for mission education (these guidelines and requirements are found in the NMI Handbook and Constitution and Mission Priority One Guidelines)
- 3. Annual subscription and reading of the Holiness Today magazine by every church family

- 4. Use of the current NMI Handbook.
- 5. Quarterly meetings of the Local NMI Council for planning, promotion and evaluation
- 6. Participation in available workshops, Missional Area, District and Southeast Regional meetings.
- 7. If possible, mission education shall be accomplished through monthly local NMI meetings promoting the monthly calendar emphasis, prayer and mission study. Use of a variety of mission education resources is recommended: mission education curriculum now named Living Mission, videos, deputation speakers, dramas, etc. Remember that the curriculum is only a guide and resource and does not have to be covered in detail monthly in order to accomplish true mission education in the local church. We encourage the freedom of each local NMI to provide exciting, interesting, innovative mission education in whatever forum works best for each local congregation. We encourage the regular use of mission spots in Sunday services to reach the greatest number of people.
- 8. Look for mission opportunities in your community, Ex: Salvation Army, Local homeless shelter.
- 9. Utilization of available NMI News services
 - a. World Mission Video Magazine
 - b. Global Glimpses
 - c. Engage Magazine (online magazine: www.engagemagazine.com)
 - d. www.nazarene.org for pictures, names, locations of missionaries on the field
 - 9. Promoting, hosting and attending services with missionaries on deputation and other mission speakers.
 10. District Goal- each church is encouraged to prepare and send at least 1 or more boxes (each) of Crisis Care Kits (CCK's) and School Pal Paks (SPP's)
